

(1) The passage is directed to believers—both the restorer(s) and the "restoree"

(2) The restoration is a task for those who are spiritual (which should be all of us!).

(3) The process of restoration is to be carried out in gentleness.

(4) The restoration process requires wisdom and humility as it can be dangerous to the restorer(s)
